Dear Mr Ravanchi,

I am an Amnesty International activist writing to express my concern with the well-being of Zeynab Jalalian, a member of Iran's Kurdish minority currently serving a life sentence in Qarchak prison in Varameen. On June 2, 2020 Zeynab Jalalian tested positive for COVID-19 at the prison's medical clinic where she was taken to after feeling unwell and suffering from severe shortness of breath.

Ms Jalalian is a Kurdish woman who is serving a life sentence given to her after a trial that lasted a few minutes, clearly failing to meet international standards. No evidence was presented linking her to armed separatists or terror activity. Before the trial she was held for 8 months with no access to a lawyer, and she claims that she was physically tortured and threatened with rape.

I am extremely concerned to hear that Zaynab Jalalian tested positive for COVID-19. For people with underlying health conditions contracting this disease can be lethal, and Zeynab Jalalian has been suffering from heart, intestinal, and kidney problems as well as an oral thrush condition. She is also at risk of losing her eyesight for which she had been denied surgery. Ms Jalalian is in need of immediate specialized medical care outside prison.

I urge you to ensure that Zeynab Jalalian is immediately provided with specialized medical care for Covid-19 and other health conditions that she has in an appropriate medical facility outside prison. I also call on you to protect her from torture and other ill-treatment, and implement the recommendation of the UN Working Group on Arbitrary Detention from April 2016, which calls for Zeynab Jalalian to be released immediately and accords an enforceable right to compensation.
