Dear President Biden,

As a member of Amnesty International USA, I am concerned about the welfare of Mohammed Abdul Malik Bajabu. A Kenyan, born on November 11, 1973, he arrived at Guantanamo Bay in 2007 after a somewhat circuitous route. He was initially seized by Kenyan police. They had failed to find any evidence that he had committed a crime but nevertheless, he was turned over to U. S. military forces. He was later sent to Djibouti and then to Bagram, Afghanistan, at least according to his lawyers, finally arriving at Guantanamo Bay in 2007.

After a review of his situation, the U.S. government finally acknowledged in December 2021 that “his low level of training and lack of leadership role” in his previous activities indicated that he posed no threat to the United States. He has therefore been cleared for transfer.

Despite his clearance for transfer he remains detained at Guantanamo Bay. I urge you to effect Bajabu’s transfer to a safe location, and to close Guantanamo Bay, once and for all. Mohammed Abdul Malik Bajabu should be provided with genuine access to rehabilitation and redress.

Thank you for your prompt attention to this important matter.
